#### <u>Attendance</u>

As a parent or caregiver, you play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance for your children. Regular attendance is needed for children to continue learning and improving their basic reading, writing and other skills they need. It also means they are likely to experience educational success.

Parents and caregivers must make sure their children are at school every day, and let the school know on the day if they are absent. Holidays, or tiredness are unjustified absences. The Ministry of Education collects information on absences from every school once a week.

All students are legally required to attend school every day and it is a shared responsibility to make sure our children attend and engage in learning at school.

It is also important that children come to school **on time (before 9.00 a.m.)** each day.

## WHY IS ATTENDING SCHOOL EVERY DAY IMPORTANT?

Attending school every day is essential for learning. It means your child can:

- Make progress in reading, writing, maths and other skills
- Feel confident in the classroom
- Make friends and build social skills
- Build good habits for life

When children are regularly absent from school they miss out on important learning. They may get behind in their schoolwork, find it difficult to maintain friendships, and may feel unsettled and anxious about coming to school.

How parents can support good attendance:


- Have a good routine in the morning and evening so your child is organised and prepared for school
- Switch off devices in the evening and remove from bedrooms to encourage a good night's sleep
- · Arrange medical and other appointments after school where possible
- · Keep family holidays and trips away in school holiday times
- Talk with your child regularly about their learning and celebrate their progress
- Talk to your child's teacher if you're having difficulty getting your child to school or have any concerns or worries.

In New Zealand children are legally required to attend school every day between the ages of 6 and 16.

#### We need your help to keep children safe.



#### What is Trinity Sunday?

Trinity Sunday is the day we celebrate the truth that God is made up of the Father, the Son (Jesus) and the Holy Spirit. The bible tells us that there is only one God but that this God is made up of three parts, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The word we use to describe this 3 in 1 God is "Trinity." That is a word made up of the word "Tri" which mean 3 (EG A tricycle has 3 wheels) and the word "Unity," which means "One" or being unified together.
