Shrove Tuesday – Pancake Day

Shrove Tuesday, also known as Pancake Day, falls on the day before Ash Wednesday. The term "Shrove" originates from "shrive," meaning to confess. In medieval times, people would confess their sins on this day to prepare for Lent. It was also a time to use up ingredients like fat, butter, and eggs before Lenten fasting, leading to the tradition of making pancakes. At St. Brigid's, all the children celebrated by making pancakes, marking the last day for indulgence before Lent. Children also enjoyed pancake races.

Ash Wednesday

The burning of palms of last year's Palm Sunday calls us to remember the glory of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem in triumph that then quickly turns to rejection. Lent (40 days) is the time to look at our lives and ask about faithfulness in living our baptism. Lent should be a time of fasting, prayer and almsgiving.

"The Time is Now! Ko Tēnei tonu te Wā!" – a captivating tagline that encapsulates the essence of our Lent resources. Each week during Lent will be dedicated to exploring a unique aspect of time, perfectly aligned with the key themes from the Gospel of that week. What's it all about?

Knox Church is looking to grow our Junior Choir. The Knox Church Choir has a long history of supporting young musicians to develop their talents. We welcome new members as we start the year.

What will we be doing?

Singing training, rehearsing choir music, dressing up as a chorister, learning about music, exploring the church.

Junior choristers sing in church on one Sunday morning each month, usually the third Sunday The rehearsal for this starts at 9.15 am and the service starts at 10 am. Junior choristers are welcome to join in any other week they want to The junior choristers work on a structured, internationally recognised education programme, Voice for Life, to earn badges and ribbons. Some also sit for Trinity College London grade examinations with many achieving outstanding results.
